Apologies for the lack of newsletters, Mrs Byrne and I are still getting used to the new arrangements.

I would like to write to you about the difficult events that are happening with our neighbour school Christchurch CoE Primary School. Most Inner London primary schools -Sacred Heart included- are struggling to adjust to the drop in primary aged children. Broadwater school in Tooting closed last year and schools across other London boroughs are also being closed. These are tragic and traumatic events for families and staff and my heart goes out to them.

As the nearest school to Christchurch it is only right that if we have spaces, that those spaces are made available to families. We have spaces in every year group and the financial pressure of empty spaces has been increasingly difficult to manage. Indeed, one of the reasons the Governing Body agreed to my involvement with Holy Ghost was the relief that it brought to the budget. A school budget is directly related to the number on roll and as such when a school is full the staffing support, the opportunities, the resources and the enrichment for the children are all improved.

Consequently, I have worked closely with Mrs Morris and the Local Authority to plan for the transition for those parents who want to take up the offer of a space at Sacred Heart. There will be those families for whom this is not the right school but, where they choose Sacred Heart, we want to be a welcoming and prepared as we can be. As a Catholic school that has always prided itself on being at the heart of its community, it is our Catholic mission to support our neighbours.

On Wednesday 31st January, at 4pm, I have invited the parents and children of Christchurch to a special open evening, so that they can hear from staff and parents and can be reassured that wherever possible, their children will be welcomed and nurtured if they choose to join us in Sacred Heart.

I ask that parents extend that Christian welcome in any interaction you might have in the coming weeks. I am also aware that some parents in Christchurch are upset at the decision and are campaigning to support the school-and that it is an emotional issue. That is not for me to comment. Our role is too support any new families as we do in all such cases.

I ask that we keep Mrs Morris, the staff of the school and the children in our thoughts.

This has been a difficult time for staff as well. Both Roger and Mr Thomas have lost parents in recent weeks. I ask that we pray for their families and think of them as they come to terms with their loss.
