I remember the arguments about children needing a mobile phone to keep in touch with their parent. Those arguments were not about uncensored access to the internet and rapidly developing media.

In school your children are NOT allowed unrestricted access to the internet or social media. The iPads and Chromebook they use are subject to safeguarding and safety restrictions. The staff monitor their use at all times and ensure all language and access is appropriate. We are able to filter all material and record who has accessed what.

Yet some children go home and all these rules go out the window. It is our job as teachers to support children with technology and it your role as parents and carers to do the same at home!
