Teaching and Learning in the Nursery Summer 1 - April 2024-2025

Early Years Foundation Stage Prime Areas for learning

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

I will be caring for the flowers and vegetables that we will be planting in our garden. I will continue to develop my ability to share, take turns and play cooperatively with my friends. I will express needs and feelings in appropriate ways. I will talk about a range of feelings and begin to think about how others feel and develop empathy e.g. to understand that if someone is not being very nice it could be because they are feeling sad inside

Language and Communication

I will be listening to stories about farms and animals, where they live, their behaviours and habitats. I will enjoy joining in when telling these stories and with support I will begin to retell these stories through drama. I will join in with rhythmic activities and will extend my repertoire of songs and rhymes. I will use talk, actions and objects to recall and relive past experiences.







Religious Education

I will learn about Pentecost and understand the church's teaching about Pentecost, the celebration of the energy the Holy Spirit gives. I will think about how I can share my love, my happiness with others and celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. I will also be learning about what it means to have a friend. I will think about being a good friend and I will learn about Jesus' special friends.

Physical Development

I will continue to develop my ability to manipulate small objects and writing implements through a range of activities such as drawing, building Duplo, Lego, etc. and threading. I will continue to develop my large motor skills through a range of activities such as throwing, catching and bouncing balls, rolling hoops, and climbing up, down, over and through a range of climbing equipment. I will learn to understand that equipment and tools need to be used safely. I will learn to follow a sequence of movements through dance, music and games. Developing my ability to find a space, listening to instructions, running, jumping, hopping and skipping.

Early Years Foundation Stage Specific Learning Areas



Mathematics

I will continue to learn to count to 10 and beyond in different ways. I will recognise the numerals 0 - 5 and sometimes match number and quantity correctly. I will begin to add groups of objects together and take objects away to find new totals. I will learn the names of flat (2D) and solid (3D) shapes and begin to recognise shapes in the environment. I will use shapes to make pictures and begin to plan what I will build using solid shapes. I will learn a range of positional language including up, down, in, out, beside, behind, in front of, above, next to.



Expressive Arts and Design

I will begin to differentiate colours using water colour to create effects and discuss how colours change. I will learn to make different coloured paint and explore its texture. I will create 3 dimensional structures using junk modelling will begin to be more independent when looking for the resources I need. I will use available resources as props for role-play and will represent my experiences and stories I have been read through role-play. I will listen to music and respond to sound with body movement. I will be drawing pictures using music to show moods.

Literacy

I will learn new words, building up the vocabulary that reflects my experiences and I will try to communicate these effectively to my friends and teachers. I will show interest in illustrations and print in books and in the environment. I will begin to distinguish between the different marks I make using a variety of media. I will engage in activities which require hand-eye coordination. I will bring home a reading book from school for me to share with my family.



Understanding the World

I will recognise some special times in my life and I will be exploring and seeking meaning in my experiences, sharing them with my friends at nursery and representing my ideas by making a variety of objects, using different materials. I will begin to try out a range of tools and techniques safely and show interest in why things happen. I will show curiosity and interest in the features of objects and living things using different senses. I will experiment with cork, grass, wood and straw and will use magnifying glasses and other tools to examine objects, plants and animals around me. I will begin to talk about my observations and represent these through collage, drawings and photographs. We will learn about animals and their habitats. We will talk about farm animals, wild animals and sea creatures.

Dear Parents/Carers,

This half term in nursery we are learning about animals. To support your child's learning please talk to your child about various animals who live on farms, wild animals and sea creatures. You might also talk about the animals that you may have at home as pets. We will also focus on one or two sounds a week. Please encourage your child to say the sound and things that start with it.

Please find attached a breakdown of what the children will be learning each week:

- PE Focusing on the basic fundamentals, Agility, Balance and Co-ordination i.e. hopping, jumping and moving at speed. Ball skills will be introduced using various methods such as; individual control, sending & receiving with hands and feet and target throwing. Summer 1 The Wimbledon Junior Tennis Initiative will deliver tennis lessons to Nursery & Reception.
 - To help your children at home, you can continue to practice these skills, throwing and catching, balancing on one foot, jumping on the spot, running from one point to another.

BAGS: Please ensure your child has a drawstring bag containing a full set of clothes (<u>pants, socks, T shirt, sweatshirt, trousers</u>) to hang on their peg so that they can change and be comfortable should they have an 'accident' at school. LIBRARY BOOKS: Share your child's library book with him or her each week; demonstrate how to turn pages carefully, encourage him or her to look at the pages from left to right and to talk about the pictures. Please help us by returning library books each Monday so they can be changed.

CLIMBING FRAME: Please do not let your child play on the climbing frames at the beginning or end of the day.
